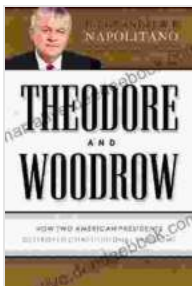


How Two American Presidents Destroyed Constitutional Freedom

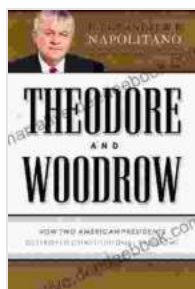
