

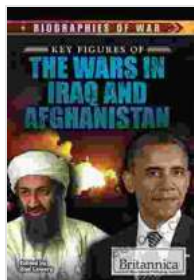

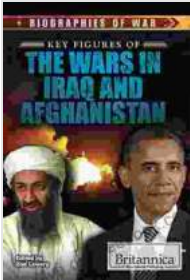
Stanley McChrystal
