

The Release



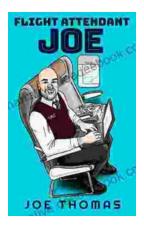
