



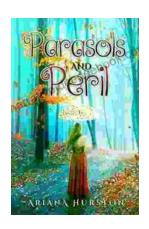
# **Map of Arizona Indian Reservations**

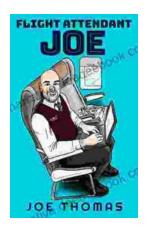
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
